

**tüchtig**, *adj.*, capable, thorough, good; *adv.*, thoroughly.

**tun** (tat, getan), *tr.*, to do, make; einem etwas zuleide tun, einem ein Leids tun, to harm or hurt a person; das tut nichts zur Sache, that is nothing to the purpose, that does not alter things. *The form täten, when used as an auxiliary = do, and is employed now only in poetry as a substitute for the imperfect: die Augen täten ihm sinken, his eyes fell; inf. as subst., doings.*

**Tür**, *f.*, -en, door; vor der Tür, outside the door.

**Turm**, *m.*, -[e]s, -e, tower.

**übel**, *adv.*, evil, ill; eine Sache übel nehmen, to take a thing amiss or in bad part.

**über**, *prep.*, over, above, beyond, across, about, concerning; as *adv. and sep. pref.*, over, above, beyond, across; den ganzen Tag über, the whole day long.

**überall**, *adv.*, everywhere.

**überant'worten**, *tr.*, to deliver up, hand over, entrust.

**ü'berbleibsel**, *n.*, -s, remnant, remains, relic.

**überein'stimmen**, *intr.*, to agree, suit.

**überfal'len** (überfiel, überfallen; überfällt), *tr.*, to fall upon suddenly, to be seized with, to take possession of.

**ü'bergehen** (ging, gegangen), *intr.* (*aux. f.*), to overflow; die Augen

gingen ihm über, his eyes were filled with tears, his eyes grew moist.

**übergie'ßen** (übergoß, übergossen), *tr.*, to pour over, deluge, cover with.

**überkom'men** (überkam, überkommen), *tr.*, to come over, seize.

**überlas'sen** (überließ, überlassen; überläßt), *tr.*, to give up; sich dem Schlafe überlassen, to give oneself up to sleep.

**übers** = über das.

**ü'berschuh**, *m.*, -[e]s, -e, overshoe, rubber shoe.

**überwa'chen**, *tr.*, to watch over, supervise.

**überzeu'gen**, *tr.*, to convince.

**Ufer**, *n.*, -s, —, shore (*of a lake*), bank (*of a river*).

**um**, *prep.*, around, about, for, at, with; um . . . herum, about, around, round about, with regard to; *conj.*, um . . . zu (*with infn.*), so as, in order to; *adv., sep. and insep. pref.*, about, around.

**umfa'n'gen** (umfieng, umfangen; umfängt), *tr.*, to surround, envelop, enclose.

**umfa'ssen**, *tr.*, to clasp round, embrace, seize around the waist.

**umfla'tern**, *tr.*, to hover around, flutter about.

**um'gürten**, *tr.*, to gird round or on.

**umhe'gen**, *tr.*, to hedge about, enclose.

**umber'**, *adv. and sep. pref.*, around, about, all around, here and there.
