## PAID FOR IT

Officer Dezella Brought the Joy Club Robbers to Time—An Expensive Experience.

The Joy Club was robbed on the Wednesday following Thanksgiving day. Some 700 shells, canned goods, bait and a revolver were taken. In all, about \$50 worth of stuff was taken from Col. Sam. Holmes' shooting box. There was a threshing on the Cartier farm, which adjoins Col. Sam. Holmes' preserve. After the threshing a number of the men went over to the club house and rifled it. P. C. Dezella and Detective McGregor, after some clever work on the case, found out all about it, and the result was the arrest of Frank Cartier and Joseph Matt, two young men who live on the adjoining concession.

The date of the trial was fixed for to-day, but the case was settled before it came to trial.

Col. Holmes offered a reward of \$200 for the capture of the robbers. This was the second occasion upon which the Joy Club had been broken into this fall and the Colonel was determined to put a stop to it.

The young men implicated paid the reward of \$100, \$50 in over the value of the goods and \$28.72 costs of the court. By the time the young fellows paid their lawyers they had a pretty good lesson.
