Settled in 1830. It has a common school, and ships grain and produce. Stages daily to West Winchester and Morrisburg, fares 15c and 85c respectively. Population, 120. Mail daily. Nearest bank at Cornwall. It contains a Methodist church and public school, and ships produce. *It is on the stage route from L'Original to Caledonia Springs, fare 10c per mile. Population, 150. A village on Nation river (which furnishes power) and on the C A Ry, in Cambridge township, Russell Co., 35 miles south-west of L'Original, the county seat, and 31 south-east of Ottawa, the nearest bank location. It contains Catholic, Episcopal and Presbyterian churches and public schools, and ships lumber, ties, cordwood, bark and timber. Stages daily to Magerville, St. Albert and Cryslar, fares 25c, 40c and 50c respectively. Population, 500. Telegraph, GNW. Express, Canadian. Mail daily. R A Casselman, postmaster.

Also known as Algona, is a country post office in Algona township, Renfrew County, 30 miles south of Pembroke, the county seat and nearest banking point, and 25 miles west of Cobden, on the CPRy, its nearest railway point. Settled in 1870. It contains a Catholic church and common school, and ships produce. Stages weekly to Eganville, Combermore and Brudenell. Population, 50. Mail weekly. Edward Bennett, postmaster.

CASTLEDERG. Also known as Mount Hurst, is a village in Albion township, Peel County, 18 miles north of Brampton, the county seat, and nearest banking point, and 3½ north-west of Bolton, on the T G and B line O div C P Ry, its nearest railway station. Settled in 1845. It has 2 Methodist churches and a public school, and ships produce. Population, 200. Mail tri-weekly. John Wallace, postmaster.
