Theology (Wesley's Sermons, i to li.) II. First Year-Biblical Introduction (Horne by Ayre, Pts. 1, 2, 3;) Theology, (Hare on Justification, Wesley on Christian Perfection, with review of Wesley's Sermons, Nos. i., v., ix., x., xl., xlv.;) History (Smith's Old Testament).

III. Second Year.—Exegosis of Matthew and John. (On Matthew, Wesley's and Watson's Notes. On John, Wesley's and Watson's Notes). Theology (Watson's Institutes, Pt. 2, Chap. i. to xvii). History of the Christian Church to the Reformation (Kurtz). Natural Philosophy (Ganot).

IV. Third Year.—Exegesis of Romans (Wesley and Whedon). Theology (Watson's Institutes, Pt. 2, Chap. xviii. to the end. Fletcher's Checks, i. to v.) History of the Reformation (Fisher). History of Methodism to the death of Wesley (Stevens). Rhetoric (Whately).
