WESTRUMITE FOR ROAD SPRINKLING.

Westrumite, the invention of Herr van Westrum, is a mixture of oil, which may be diluted as desired and sprinkled over a road with an ordinary watering cart. The water evaporates, leaving the westrumite as a moist film, which absolutely prevents the rising of dust. Tested in London on a dry roadway where every vehicle raised clouds of dust, the material so affected the surface that several automobiles at highest speed raised no dust whatever.-Exchange.
