

 Pittsburg, July 8.—Thus far in July the steel trade has been quite as active as during June, and there are not present indications of a flattening out of the buying movement. The rail-roads have been almost whiely responsible for the small scale revival of business, as their purchases of rails and care, as well as bridge and other interial, not only prevented a material curtailment of tonnare but the complete shutting down of some mills as well.
 As regards prices, the situation shows no change. In some instances the tendency is slightly firmer, but most of the prompt delivery business is still heing accepted at the same levy els that have been ruling for the past month. The United States Steel Corporation is doing relatively better than the independents as far as new bookings a concert, and its mills are operating at around 62 per cent. of capacity as compared with about 56 per cent. of the independents.
