any Street, or Highway, to be forthwith re-
moved, and in case the person who shall
have laid the same thereon be known, to
cause him to be prosecuted as directed by
the third section of the said herein-before re-
cited Act, and in case such person be not
known, the said articles if saleable, shall be
forfeited and sold by order of the said Com-
missioner or Surveyor, after three days pub-
lic notice; unless sooner claimed, and the
proceeds arising from such sale, shall be ap-
plied to the repairing of such Streets or
Highways; after deducting the charges of
removing the said Incumbrances, and in case
such Incumbrances be of a nature not to
produce any thing by the sale thereof, then
the said Commissioners or Surveyors shall be
empowered to employ any person liable to
labour on the Highways, to remove such In-
cumbrances, which person shall be allowed
therefor according to the time he may be
employed, to be deducted from the time he
shall be by Law liable to work on the Streets
or Highways.

Former Act to
continue in force.

VII. *And be it further enacted*, That the
said recited Act, and every clause thereof,
except wherein the same is altered and a-
mended, shall continue and be in full force,
any thing to the contrary herein contained
notwithstanding.

Limitation.

VIII. *And be it further enacted*, That this
Act shall continue and be in force as long
as the said recited Act, of which this is an
amendment and no longer.
