The Friends' General Conference, which recently was held in Massey Hall, Toronto, calls special attention to a people who have exercised a Hall, Toronto, calls special attention to a people who have exercised a marked influence on religious thought. George Fox, the founder of the society, emphasized the idea of the soul being illuminated by the spirit of God, and of its being an unerring and sufficient guide to itself. Man was called from listening to external authority to listening to the voice within. "Mind the light" was his admonition. But while man was taught to be a rule unto himself, the Friends have sought for education and enlightemment so as to make the man a better light and guide. The Philadelphia yearly meeting of Friends has 43 colleges and schools under its care, from the kindergarten to the degree-conferring college. The Friends insist on the value of a secular training under good religious influence. Swarthmore and Haverford Colleges in Pennsylvania, and Bryn Mawr, the celebrated women's school, are all institutions identified with the body of Friends. Cornell, Johns Hopkins and Brown Universities were all founded by Quakers.


