## ONTARIO BRIBERY CASE.

Judges Decide Against Prosecution Inquiring Into Particulars

As to the Disposition of the Liberal Campaign Fund.

A Private Examination of Books May be Allowed Later.

TORONTO, May 5.—The proposed line of attack of the prosecution in the Gurney case has been decidedly restricted, for the Commission this morning refused in part Mr. Blake's application of yesterday to inquire into the general Liberal campaign fund in the hope of finding the source of the \$3,000 paid Gurney. Chancellor Boyd ruled that all other evidence should first be heard and then if the source was not found the Commission might enquire privately into the fund, but only during the time referred to by Mr. Gurney, from August 1902 to March 1903. Mr. Stratton then went into the box again.

## WEST AFRICA.

Millions of Slaves Still in Bondage in the British Sphere of Influence.

Charles H. Allen, recently Secretary of the Anti Slavery Society, in a letter to The London Spectator, makes some revelations as to the extent of slaveholding within the newly acquired territories in West Africa. He says in part:

In your interesting article commencing "Another kingdom acquired this week," you state, "I fear with considerable truth, that 'the British people as a body know absolutely nothing about it, not even its geography.' Some of your readers may be interested in knowing that a volume by Charles H. Robinson, M. A., published in 1896 by Sampson Low & Co., under the title "Hausaland," contains a mass of information respecting Sokoto and the great city of Kano, 'the Manchester of tropical Africa,' which deserves careful study at the present time. I had the privilege of an interview with some seven years ago with Mr. Robinson shortly after his return from a visit to Kano. He informed me that in Hausaland, under the British sphere of influence, there then existed five million slaves, and that five hundred were often to be seen for sale in the Kano market. They formed, in fact, the main currency of the land, and were used as payment in all transactions too large to be met by the bulky bags of cowries. The annual tribute to the Sultan of Sokoto was paid by the ruler of Kano and all other small chiefs in the form of slaves, and, said to exist, these were nearly all raided from the neighboring outlying villages, so that there may be said to have been an all most constant civil war throughout the land. To give some idea of the vast number of slaves Mr. Robinson estimates that if the whole population of the world were brought together, one out of every three hundred would be a Hausa-speaking slave. Perhaps this might be more easily understood by the British public if I state that if all London were suddenly emptied of its inhabitants, this vast metropolis might be filled by the slaves held in captivity in Hausaland. It is very well known that Kano is the great commercial emporium of central tropical Africa, and that its calicoes, beautifully made from native cotton, are eagerly purchased in the ports of western and northern Africa and may be obtained in Egypt and on the Red Sea.

## SHOT HER HUSBAND.

BUFFALO, N. Y., May 4.—John H. Costello, capitalist, mine owner and lumber merchant, was shot in the back and seriously wounded this afternoon by his wife in a corridor of the Prudential building. Immediately after the shooting Mrs. Costello walked down to the police headquarters and gave herself up. No charge will be lodged against the woman pending the outcome of Mr. Costello's wound.

## MT. ALLISON COLLEGE.

Rev. W. G. Watson of Toronto Conference Chosen to Succeed Dr. Stewart.

SACKVILLE, N. B., May 4.—It is understood that the committee of regents appointed to secure a successor to Doctor Stewart, have offered the chair to Rev. W. G. Watson, of the Toronto Conference, and that Mr. Watson has signified his willingness to accept.  
Mr. Watson is regarded as one of the rising scholars of the west. Both at Toronto University, where he graduated in arts in 1891, and at Victoria, where he took the full B. D. course, his record for scholarship was very high. At Victoria he took the gold medal for divinity and after graduation he studied at Toronto University for three years in the honor department of orientals and took highest honors at the end of the year.

He is credited with an unusual mastery of the problems of Biblical history and criticism and, with the possession of ample stores of theological learning generally. His Hebrew scholarship is reported as very thorough.  
It is generally supposed that Doctor Paisley will be appointed to the deanship of the theological faculty.

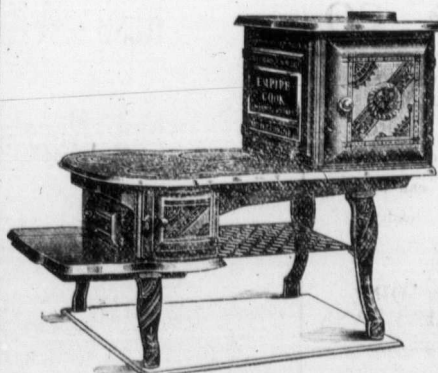
