laid on the Table of this House, relating to the mission of the said delegation, and the negotiations connected therewith, there is no promise, guarantee or assurance given, on the part of the latter, that they will assume hereafter the improving and maintaining of said property as a charge upon the Dominion Government, or refund this Province all or any of the money expended on the aforesaid structures since this Island entered Confederation.

Therefore Resolved, That this House believe that in providing 'ways and means' for the expenditure of the Province for the current year, the Government are not justified in the course being pursued from refunds from the Dominion Government, for repairs, which refund the said Government have not, so far, acknowledged.

they had no intention of accepting these works. Their most object was to make an examination of the structures, and this was the only promise which the delegates received. The Dominion Government seemed to be very doubtful if any of these wharves belonged to them, and they agreed to examine a claim for indemnity, and whether any and what sum should be paid the Province. In the face of this the Government estimated that they would receive \$35,000. The examination must first be made, and a report obtained as to whether the wharves are of general public importance or not. It was evidently their opinion that common wharves in rivers did not belong to them, for they spoke of general public importance. The report of the examiners would be submitted to the Dominion Government and it was hard to get a quorum of the Cabinet together in summer time. They would then have to lay the report before Parliament. Admitting that these wharves are Dominion works, and that we had spent money on them, in point of law we had no claim for a refund, as it was a voluntary action on our part. There was no precedent in any Legislature for calculating upon what we did not know that we should receive, and admitting that our claim was good we would not get one dollar of it this year. That disposed of \$36,000 of the estimated revenue. The receipts from the Land Office were calculated at too high a figure by \$10,000. Education had been placed at \$1,700 less than was spent on it last year, maintenance of Hospital for the Insane, \$1,000 less, and the Poorhouse \$600 less. These were expenditures which must be met, and unless the Government came forward with more correct figures, he trusted that the vote would not be given them. There was the item of \$36,000 as well as some \$15,000 more, that would not be realized this year, and how would this deficiency be met? What would be our position if our wharves were all handed over to some incorporated Company. If such a thing should happen, and the Company had power to exact tolls and dues, would there find that we had never made a worse bargain. The Government either did not know what they were doing, or they were doing what they knew was wrong.

The debate was further adjourned, and at 6 1/2 p. m., the House adjourned for one hour.
