A Committe appointed to consider electoral action separated as follows:—That this convention affirm the necessity of electing psehibitionists to all representative bodies; that it is desirable to form a prohibitory electoral union in each municipality, members of which shall be pledged to support for municipal and Parliamentary positions each candidates only as are known and professed prohibitionists, who will work and vote for the enacting, sustaining and enforcing of enacting, sustaining and enforcing of prohibitory legislation; that this Convention request the Executive of the Provincial Alliance to take such measures as are necessary for the organization of the proposed unions as to suggest to the branches of the Dominion Alliance in other Provinces the desirabilities of the branches of the Dominion Alliance in other Provinces the desirability of similar action. 
