Big Fire at **Bell Island**

FOUR BUSINESS PLACES AND PRI-VATE HOUSES WIPED OUT.

Early yesterday morning a disasrous fire broke out at Bell Island. and in a couple of hours the houses and business places of Messrs. Hearne and Kent, Patrick O'Brien and Abraham Coen were a mass of ruins. Only meagre particulars could be gleaned here of the occurrence up to yesterday afternoon, but we learn that a widespread conflagration was averted only by the excellent work of the D. I. S. and N. S. fire companies and the miners and residents. A brisk S. W. gale blew at the time, water was scarce, and only by almost superhunan efforts was the pharmacy owned by Dr. Jones saved from destruction. The people who owned the property lost most of their furniture and effects and had no insurance, except in the case of Mr. Coen, who carried policies to the amount of \$3,000. All the houses except Coen's were without chimnies, stove pipes running up through the roofs, and one of these becoming heated, it is thought, caused the conflagration.
