Lloyd-George to Receive Irish-Amer. Delegation

Germany Cannot Send Military Instructors Abroad.

Indian Government Issues New Seditious Ordinance --- Japanese Representatives Declare Their Country Humiliated.

A FALSE REPORT.

PARIS, April 21. The naval port of Sebastopol in the Crimea has not been occupied by Russian Soviet troops, according to a despatch to the Journal Des Debats, dated Sunday, at Salonika.

BERLIN STRIKE OFF.

BERLIN, April 19. A settlement of the general strike in Berlin was reached to-day, after negotiations lasting forty-eight hours between representatives of the strikers and the employers and the Minister of Labor. The settlement is tantamount to active recognition of the demand of the strikers that they be given a voice in determining engagements and promotions of employees in all work, except in executive and directorate positions.

FORESTALLING THE HUNS.

PARIS, April 21. The Council of Foreign Ministers to-day approved of the Peace Treaty intended to forestall any effort the Germans might have to re-establish a military machine by utilizing outside force. The article prohibits the sending of German military instructors to foreign countries. It was referred to the drafting committee.

WILL RECEIVE IRISH DELEGATES

PARIS, April 21. David Lloyd George, the British Premier, has agreed to receive former Governor Edward F. Dunne, of Illinois; F. P. Walsh, former Chairman of the National War Labor Board, and Michael J. Ryan, of Philadelphia, next week. The Americans were chosen by the Irish Societies in the United States to appeal to the Peace Conference on behalf of Ireland.

THE PEACE TERMS.

PARIS, April 21. Though the Peace Conference apparently was taken by surprise of Germany's intention to send a small delegation to Versailles to receive the text of the treaty, the plan is really old, and Berlin and Weimar despatches to the Associated Press more than a month ago indicated that the German delegates would not have power to make final decisions. The determination of the German Foreign Office was based upon misapprehension of the programme for the initial meeting of the German plenipotentiaries with the representatives of the Peace Conference. It had been understood, through press statements, that at the first meeting the German delegates would merely be handed the text of the treaty, but would not be permitted to discuss the terms and would be sent back to Germany to confer with the Government and the National Assembly, returning after a stipulated interval to Versailles with the actual discussions.

ACCEPTS ALLIES' CONDITIONS.

PARIS, April 22. Germany has notified the Allies that

she accepts all the Allied conditions respecting the Versailles conference. This official announcement was made to-night.

RUSSIA'S PROPOSALS.

WASHINGTON, April 21. The Embassy here made public to-day the outline of the plan presented to the Peace Conference by Russian representatives at Paris to solve the Russian problems. It asks recognition as de facto of all national authorities which are inspired by "democratic ideals and enjoy the support of the population" pending the setting up of a federation of Russian states.

JAPAN'S DISSATISFACTION.

TOKIO, April 19. In an editorial commenting on the failure of the racial equality clause in securing a place in the Covenant of the League of Nations, the Japan Times declares that the national disappointment of Japan verges upon dissatisfaction and affords opportunity for sensationalists to stir up anti-white prejudice. Representative Japanese regard the Paris decision as a slap and a humiliation, the newspaper says.

TAKING NO CHANCES.


SIMLA, India, April 21. (Reuter's Ottawa Agency.)—The Governor General has promulgated a fresh ordinance providing that any court martial or commission may sentence a person convicted under martial law to transportation for life or ten years, or rigorous imprisonment for seven years and not exceeding fourteen years. The defence of India rules have also been amended, providing that no newspaper can be printed or published without previous sanction by the local government.

BOLSHEVIK REVERSES.

LONDON, April 21. (Reuter's Ottawa Agency.)—Telegrams from Omsk report that the troops of Admiral Kolchak, thirty-three miles south of Sterlitamak, inflicted severe losses on the enemy, capturing many prisoners, machine guns and ten heavy guns. They also captured Starup with great booty and a number of Bolshevik leaders. Demoralization of the Bolsheviks is reported to be growing. Three Bolshevik divisions refused to fight and have been withdrawn from the front. The peasants of the district on the River Kama have revolted against the Bolshevik Government.

SUPPORTING STRIKE.

LIMERICK, April 21. The general strike here, incident to the proclamation of Limerick as a military area, assumed a new and interesting phase to-day, when the Finance Commission of the Limerick Trades and Labor Council announced that it was preparing to issue its own money in the form of one shilling and ten shilling notes, which would

Bay of Islands Herring Fishery.

(Western Star.)
We are pleased to be able to give our readers complete statistics of the herring fishery in Bay of Islands the past season. The fall herring fishery of 1918-19 occupied two and a half months, beginning with the first of November and ending at the middle of January. The catch for that period, which represented an outlay of over a quarter million dollars to purchase, was made up of the following packs and styles:

Salt bulk	18,549 1/2 brls.
Scotch style	15,873 "
Pickled	2,234 "
Ordinary salt	2,442 1/2 "
Round salt	843 "
Split	233 "
Norwegian style	135 "
Frozen	63 "

Of the Scotch style pack, there were shipped direct to the American market from Woods Islands by vessels 369 1/2 barrels; from Curling 728 1/2 barrels, and to St. John's by rail and steamers, 4737, making a total of 15,708 barrels; and 165 barrels remain unshipped, making in all for the Bay 15,873 barrels by the Scotch method. Of other styles, there were shipped from Curling 2,442 1/2 brls. ordinary salted herring, 283 brls. split, 63 brls. frozen, 643 brls. round salt, and 137 brls. Norwegian, bring the total shipment from this port up to

15,584 barrels. From Woods Island there were shipped by vessel 18,549 1/2 barrels of salt bulk, and 3234 barrels of pickled herring, this together with the Scotch style shipment from that port make a total of 25,474 barrels, thus making a grand total for the Bay of Islands 1918-19 fall catch of 41,223 barrels. These fish were practically all caught in Humber and Middle Arras.
