AMHERSTBURG AFTER THE NEXT BIG FIGHT. The recent fight in Jacksonville and the approaching contest between Corbett and Jackson has awakened some of the citizens of Amherstburg to the fact that right at their door is one of the most available places for a prize fight in America, and they will make an offer to the pugilists. The place is Bois Blane Island, opposite Amherstburg in the Detroit River. The island is the property of Col. John Atkinson, and he will be waited on this week and asked for permission. It is in Canadian waters, but no trouble is anticipated from the authorities. Those who are behind the scheme are well known citizens of the burg, and if the island can be secured they will at once make an offer of \$30,000. They will not place the tickets at a high figure, but would expect bonuses from the owners of the different steamboat lines, and erect an amphitheater with a capacity of 10,000 persons.

HAILED THE VICTOR. New York, Jan. 28.—The popularity of victory was demonstrated yesterday afternoon, when 2,000 cheering people gathered at the depot of the Pennsylvania Railroad in Jersey City to welcome the arrival of James J. Corbett. Corbett said that he had received ovations all along the line. As to his future prospects he felt very enthusiastic. "I shall not keep in as hard training as I am now," he said, "but I will not get out of it to such an extent that it will be necessary to do a great amount of hard work when I prepare for the fight with Peter Jackson in June or July." The fight will come off between the 10th of June and the 10th of July.

Nearly every seat in Madison Square Garden was occupied last evening by friends and admirers of Jim Corbett. They had paid from 50 cents to \$2 each for a chance to welcome him and gave him unstinted applause.

IN THE INTERESTS OF LAW AND ORDER. New Haven, Conn., Jan. 28.—The International Law and Order League is not as all inclined to let the Corbett-Mitchell matter drop. Rev. Clarence Greeley, general agent of the league, says he is in-formed by his attorney in Jacksonville that Manager Bowden is afraid to let the Supreme Court pass on sec. 1, chap. 66, of McMillan's digest of the Florida decisions. This section, he says, and the one following fix a good round penalty for principals and all promoters. Mr. Greeley has advised President Connolly, of the Jacksonville league, to carry the matter to the Supreme Court in case the Governor does not, and at the expense of the internation-

al league.

Johnson, champion ice skater of America, broke the world's half-mile record of 1:22 by skating a mile here to-day in 1:16 3-5, with a flying start. Harry Hulse, of Toronto, with a set start, skated a quarter mile in 36 seconds, beating the best previous record, which was 37 3-5.

THE KENNEL. THE CAT WHIPPED THE DOG. HUNTINGTON, W. Va., Jan. 28.—A large crowd of people witnessed a contest between a wildcat and a bulldog yesterday. The cat whipped the dog in three minutes' time, putting out one eye and otherwise injuring him. Those interested in the fight will be arrested and prosecuted by the Humane Society.

DRAUGHTS. The open air draught board in Wellington Park, Greenock, was put there by the town council nearly 40 years ago. It is twelve feet square, and the men weigh fourteen pounds each. It has afforded an immense amount of enjoyment, and is as popular as ever.

CURLING. The curling matches for group 11 of the Ontario tankard competition, will be played in Brantford on Jan. 30. The clubs competing are Brantford, Ayr, Embro, Simcoe, London, Preston, Plattsville and Dundas. CURLERS KICK.

The Sarnia Observers of Saturday says the curlers in that district objected to being compelled to play the finals in London, which is outside the district.
