TRAVELER'S FATAL FALL NORTHWEST ELECTIONS

Dropped From Window and Broke His Neck.

Windsor Man Drowned in Detroit River—Boy Drowned at Tweed.

Peterboro, May 23.—A. A. Benson, traveler for H. W. Petrie, Toronto, met death about 1 o'clock yesterday morning by falling from a window on the second story of the National Hotel, his neck being broken by the fall. Dr. Gray, coroner, after examining the body, which was clad in a night robe, decided that an inquest was unnecessary. Mr. Benson, who came to Peterboro on Tuesday, was about 63 years of age, and leaves a wife, who resides at Mitchell, Ont.

BOY DROWNED AT TWEED.
Tweed, Ont., May 23.—The 5-year-old son of Mrs. Dondeneau was drowned yesterday morning while playing on the logs in the river here. The body has not been recovered as yet.

DROWNED AT WINDSOR.
Windsor, May 23.—Frederick Pare, aged 26, was drowned at the Michigan Central dock, Wednesday afternoon, while fishing for minnows. When lifting his net the pole broke, and Pare lost his balance and fell into the water. He had come to the top twice when Wm. Zimmerman, of the ferry transport, plunged into the water and made a plucky attempt to save the drowning man, but in vain. Pare disappeared to the surface three times and then disappeared. Pare was a manufacturer of novelties, which he sold on the street and at fairs. He leaves behind him a 19-year-old widow and two infant children—Hazel, 2 years old, and a baby girl, who was born nine days ago. Pare was born in McGregor, Ont., and came to Windsor in 1891. He married three years ago.

HOGS SLAUGHTERED BY THE HUNDRED

Government Inspector Tenant Dealing With the Plague.

Woodstock, May 23.—John King, the well-known hog buyer, of Hickson, slaughtered and burned 300 hogs because they were infected with hog cholera. The disease set in about a week ago, and the government inspector ordered them destroyed at once. Mr. King will receive two-thirds of the value of the animals from the government.
