

SUPERVISE IMPORT  
OF FOREIGN EGGS

Conference of Producers Pass Resolution to Prohibit Eggs Under Canadian Standards.

## PROMISES CONSIDERATION

Hon. W. B. Motherwell Not in Favor of Prohibitive Floor of Resolution, Though.

Ottawa, March 7.—A resolution prohibiting (unless under Canadian standards) the importation of foreign eggs was passed at the session yesterday of the egg producers, dealers and consumers in conference at the Chateau Laurier. The resolution, a compromise, was carried unanimously after a protracted discussion in which all sides to the question were thoroughly debated.

Hon. W. B. Motherwell, minister of agriculture, did not express entire satisfaction with the result of the voting. He stated he was much impressed with the fact that all the parties had come together and passed a unanimous compromise resolution. It was, however, nothing more than a compromise in his opinion.

Mr. Motherwell described the solution as nothing less than a distinct change of mind, and stated he could tell from the remarks of those speaking that their hearts were not changed, though supporting the resolution. He said the result saved of the prohibitive and that such a proposition needed careful consideration. Further, he would have to be convinced of its feasibility.

Most Important Factors.

He pointed out that producers and consumers were the most important factors, and while the distributors were necessary, they were not of the same importance. He had to be shown why, if eggs had the same quality, it was not possible to have them graded according to the Canadian standards. He promised, however, full consideration of the whole question and stated that his department would meet the trade as far as was consistently possible with the general principle embodied in the resolution.

Other important resolutions passed were: "That imported eggs be distributed in the original packages or in packages marked showing the country of origin."

"That all foreign eggs in shell or otherwise state clearly the country of origin." In this the retailers dissented.

Country of Origin.

"That all imported eggs other than those in the shell come in packages plainly and distinctly marked, showing the country of origin, and that when used in the manufacture of foods, and where such foods are sold at a conspicuous sign with two-inch letters, must be placed by the seller so that the consumer may know the country of origin."

"That the department of agriculture arrange for the supervising of the canned-egg industry."

"That no person operating any cold storage plant shall receive eggs for storage or shall store eggs there, in without an accompanying certificate in writing from the owner of such eggs. Certifying that said eggs have been candled and all bad and unsound eggs removed."

"That no person shall receive, sell or demand payment for bad eggs in excess of a margin of allowance of one per cent on the total of each transaction."

SHORTENS TERM

SCIENTIST WILL  
PROBE MYSTERY

Dr. W. Franklin Prince to Remain in Nova Scotia "Haunted House."

WITHHOLDS JUDGMENT

Does Not Expect to Discover Anything of Sensational Character.

Halifax, N. S., March 7.—The Herald this morning received its first report from Dr. W. Franklin Prince, investigating officer of the American Institute of Psychological Research, who has been brought to Nova Scotia for the purpose of probing the recent mysterious happenings at the Alexander McDonald home—Caledonia Mills, Antigonish County.

Dr. Prince spent last night at Antigonish, where his first report was written, and set out this morning with his party in a sleigh for the McDonald home.

Dr. Prince says his first task on arrival in Nova Scotia was to make a careful study of the reports of Messrs. Harold Whidden (newspaper correspondent), and P. O. Carroll, provincial detective, and the accounts of interviews with earlier witnesses, and his present conclusions may thus be summarized: "There appears to be no reason to doubt the good faith of Mr. and Mrs. Alexander McDonald, the MacGillivray, neighbors of the McDonalds, and other witnesses."

"In all probability they have told the truth as they understood it, whether their interpretation of the facts is correct or not. As to Mr. Whidden, I have no doubt whatever that his account is absolutely truthful, that he and Carroll heard sounds of unknown origin and experienced sensations which they described as 'slaps.' It is too early for me to pronounce an opinion regarding the cause of their experiences. No extravagant expectations should be entertained of anything that I shall witness or see."

"That singular sounds and even physical sensations may be experienced is, judging by other cases known to me personally, not improbable, but nothing whatever may occur, and if anything does it may be quite tame to the average man. On the other hand a mere succession of sounds, if it could be proven that they were not due to physical causes, would be of transcendent significance to science."

HORTICULTURISTS TAKE  
STAND AGAINST REQUEST

St. Thomas Society Passes Resolution in Opposition to Sharing of Annual Grants.

ST. THOMAS, March 6.—Because it believed that it was decidedly unfair of the Ontario Horticultural Society to ask the individual horticultural societies in the cities and towns of the province to give a portion of their annual grants received from the government to help establish societies in towns where there are no organizations, the St. Thomas Horticultural Society at a meeting Monday afternoon voted unanimously against such a request embodied in a resolution passed at the annual meeting of the central body in Toronto.

It was proposed by the provincial organization that all societies should give a percentage of their annual grants, according to the amount received. Those receiving \$100 or less from the government would be asked to give 3 per cent, those receiving more than a certain amount would be expected to give 10 per cent.

Because the grants are based on the membership of the different organizations it was felt by the members the larger societies would be carrying a great portion of the burden of smaller organizations.

The share of the local organization would have been \$80, as the annual grant is \$800.

Without a single exception, except perhaps the secretary and the president, who were neutral, the St. Thomas members were outspoken against the proposition. The demand was shared exceedingly unfair. It was felt that if the central organization needed money to establish other societies special grants should be asked from the government.

A letter to this effect was sent to the provincial society.

RECEIVE MUCH CLOTHING

Kitchener Committee Members' Appeal Brings Generous Response.

KITCHENER, March 6.—As the result of the announcement of the clothing drive for the benefit of the families suffering from the present depression, the community clothing committee has been flooded with clothing from all quarters of the city.

The response which has only just begun is a most generous one, and if it keeps up there will perhaps be enough clothing to pass to other communities.

clared the government had refused to alter a single line of the Free State bill at the request of the Ulster members, yet, as soon as the Dublin people had passed a resolution necessitating a change in the bill the government agreed to that change.

Capt. Craig and others of the Ulster members announced that they would make further part in the discussion of the committee stage of the measure, and one by one they left the house.

One member while going out declared it would be well to discuss the bill elsewhere.

Lord Henry Cavendish Bentinck later raised the question in the house, feeling that in 1874 a formal treaty was concluded between the British government and the Six Nations Indians, the validity of which had been repeatedly recognized, even as recently as in 1909, by the Canadian government, the under-secretary for foreign affairs, C. R. Harcourt, M.P., would state when and by what parties the treaty had been renounced.

Right Hon. Winston Churchill, secretary of state for the colonies, replied that if the questioner referred to the so-called Haldimand treaty, a question which had arisen as to whether the Six Nations Indians occupying the lands set apart by the government are amenable to certain Canadian legislation. This, he said, was entirely for the Canadian government to deal with.

BRIDGES DESTROYED.

DUBLIN, March 6.—Communication between Fermanagh and Free County being interrupted during week-end, the roads were torn and bridges destroyed. It is not known by whom the destruction was done.

Andrew Gilmore, riding a bicycle to his home in Banbridge, County Down, last night, disregarded a demand by the special constable that he halt. The patrol, therefore, fired on him and he suffered a fractured jaw and an injury to his leg.

CONSTABLES SHOT.

BELFAST, March 6.—While doing duty on Crumlin road, Special Constables Steel and Aines were shot and wounded. Sniping continued throughout the evening. A motor van of the co-operative society was attacked and burned in the Falls road.

Unknown men entered the house of Katherine Lynch here tonight and shot her dead.
