Statement

President Mitchell Intimates He Will Make Important Announcement To-Morrow.

This is Thought to Be the Declaration of End of Strike.

Results of the Conference of the Mine Workers Officials.

Hemelton, Pa., Oct. 24.—President Mitchell to-night announced that he would to-morrow, probably late in the afternoon or evening, issue a statement defining the position of the United Mine Workers in the present situation of the strike.

The impression around headquarters is that the statement will contain practically a declaration that the strike is ended.

The coal companies controlling about 75 per cent of the anthracite coal produced in Pennsylvania have issued notices, but President Mitchell will not say that all of them comply with the terms of the Scranton convention.

The big companies in this district that have not posted the notices are the J. H. Markle & Navigation Co., and Cox, Bos. & Co. Markle & Navigation Co. has granted no increase in wages of any kind.

To-day's conference was in session three hours, and was adjourned until to-morrow morning. President Mitchell at its conclusion announced that the situation was partly canvassed, and that the remainder would be completed to-morrow.
