

MUNICIPALITY OF ANNAPOLIS.

BY-LAWS.

Approved 1881. Door Law Amended.

No. 1.—A COMMON SEAL FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANNAPOLIS.

1. Be it ordained by the County Council of the Municipality of Annapolis that the following device and inscription, viz: A ship, together with a sheaf of wheat and sickle, representing Commerce and Agriculture in the center, enclosed with the words "Municipality of Annapolis, N. S. Inc. 42 Vic. Chap. 1, 1870". The same to be engraved upon metal two inches in diameter by the seal of the Municipality of Annapolis. The said seal shall remain in the custody of the Clerk and shall be used in all cases in which the manner of affixing the same may not be otherwise directed by the Council be affixed by him to all leases, licenses, contracts and other instruments and writings which shall from time to time be granted, issued, or entered into by order of the Council, or which are or may be provided for by law.

2. Be it ordained that the County Council shall have full power and authority at any time to direct the manner of affixing such seal to any document or writing in any other manner than herein provided.

No. 2.—TO DIRECT THE PAYMENT OF ALL FEES OR MONIES OR MONEY DEBITED THE USE OF THE SEAL.

Be it ordained by the County Council of the Municipality of Annapolis, that all fees and dues collected from the use of the co-operation seal be paid into the County Treasury, unless otherwise specially directed by the said Council.

No. 3.—RELATING TO THE FERRY ACROSS THE ANNAPOIS RIVER BETWEEN THE TOWNS OF ANNAPOLIS AND GRANVILLE FERRY (SO CALLED).

Be it ordained by the County Council of the Municipality of Annapolis: 1. The ferryman holding license to ferry across said river between the above named places shall at all times keep a sufficient number of good, efficient and safe boats, clean and in good order, properly floored, for the conveyance of passengers, horses, carriages and teams to and fro, and unlofted cattle, sheep, swine, merchandise, produce, etc.

2. That the ferryman, so licensed as aforesaid, shall always provide himself with a printed copy of the By-Laws, Rules and Regulations relating to said Ferry, and shall exhibit and show the same to any passengers who may require the same, and shall have such by-laws, rules and regulations always fixed or hung up in some conspicuous part of the slip or slip upon which he receives and lands passengers.

3. That the most prompt attention shall at all times be shown to the ferryage of passengers, and in no case shall the round trip between the places above named exceed thirty minutes, unless prevented by ice or tempestuous weather, and no ferry-boat shall be taken off its line under any pretense whatever.

4. That the limits of said Ferry shall extend from the bridge connecting Annapolis town with Bay View Island, on the one side, to the Queen's Wharf on the Annapolis side of the river, and from Sir's point, to Johnson's creek, so called, on the Granville side of said river.

5. That the established hours of ferry shall be as follows, viz: from the 31st day of October to the 31st day of March, the hours between which the steamer shall ply shall be from 7 o'clock a. m. to 7 o'clock p. m.; after which last mentioned hour a row boat shall be kept on said ferry for the conveyance of passengers, horses, carriages, and other articles, and the number of days actually employed, travel, and all other necessary data, at least thirty days previous to the Annual Meeting of the Council in each and every year.

No. 9.—RELATING TO THE MANNER AND TIME OF PAYMENT OF THE SALARIES OF THE CLERK AND TREASURER OF THE MUNICIPALITY.

Be it ordained by the County Council of the Municipality of Annapolis as follows: That the Clerk and Treasurer of the Municipality of Annapolis shall be paid their salaries quarterly at the end of each and every quarter.

No. 10.—RELATING TO THE FEES TO BE CHARGED BY THE SUBROVERS OF LUMBER AND COAL, RESPECTIVELY.

Be it ordained by the County Council of the Municipality of Annapolis as follows: That Surveyors of Lumber shall receive per thousand feet, 25c; Cordwood, per cord, 5c; Coal, per ton, 10c.

No. 11.—RELATING TO THE JAIL LIMITS.

Be it ordained by the County Council of the Municipality of Annapolis as follows: That the Jail Limits of the Municipality of Annapolis shall extend from a southerly direction to the mill-board, so called, and from the said southern end in a northerly direction to and over Bay View, so called, occupied as a wharfy.

No. 12.—RELATING TO LICENSES OF FERRIES EXERCISED BY THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANNAPOLIS.

Be it ordained by the County Council of the Municipality of Annapolis as follows: 1. That before any exhibition, performance of wild animals, showman, circus, stunts, gymnastic feats or such acts or feats as common showmen, or circus riders usually exhibit, shall be allowed to be held or take place anywhere within the limits of the Municipality, the owner or owners, agent or agents, manager or managers, or person or persons, appearing to be in charge thereof, shall take out license for said exhibition and pay therefor the sum of fifteen dollars per day, for each and every day of exhibition within the limits of the Municipality, the said sum of fifteen dollars per day, to be paid to the Clerk, and by him into the funds of the Municipality.

2. That a license fee of not more than five dollars, not less than two dollars, shall be paid by the owner or owners, proprietor or proprietors, agent or agents, manager or managers, person or persons, appearing to be in charge of each and every minor itinerant exhibition of every kind or character whatever, before said parties shall be privileged to exhibit within the limits of the Municipality, said sum to be paid to the Clerk, and by him into the funds of the Municipality.

3. That if any person or persons shall hold or give, or commence or give, or not more than twenty dollars fine of not more than twenty dollars for breach of the provisions contained in the first clause of this by-law, and a fine of not more than ten dollars for the breach of the provisions contained in the second clause of this by-law.

4. That the application of this first hereinbefore mentioned shall be construed to mean each time said exhibition or exhibitions shall be held or attempted to be held within the limits of the Municipality without license.

5. That the said fines shall be levied by summary distress, before a justice of the Peace, upon the goods and chattels, and property of or belonging to such exhibition or exhibitions, whether the owner shall be known or not.

No. 13.—RELATING TO THE RENEWAL OF LICENSES OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANNAPOLIS AS FOLLOWS:—

1. That on notice of any rate payer, or on view, any Cattle Reeve finding any animal described in 116 Statutes of this Province as unlawful to run at large, shall forthwith take possession of such animal or animals, and keep them securely, and feed them, and advertise them in at least three places within the Ward where found, calling on the owner or owners to prove property and pay expenses, and if such animal or animals are not claimed nor expenses paid within five days from the date of advertising, it shall be lawful for such Cattle Reeve to apply to any Justice of the Peace for the County of Annapolis, and obtain therefor to advertise said animal or animals publicly, and sell the same under the same restrictions as aforesaid, and the sale of goods taken under execution.

2. That in the case of dispute between the Reeve and owner or owners of animals, as to amount of fees and costs incurred in keeping and selling the same, said disputes to be determined by one Justice of the Peace holding the order, and any one order has been issued, then any Justice shall determine the amount on application from either the Reeve or the owner of said animal, and such decision shall be final.

3. That the fees of such Justice of the Peace shall be for every order of sale, fifty cents to each Justice, and for every examination of accounts and decision, \$2.00.

4. That any Cattle Reeve, after complaint made by any freeholder, neglecting or refusing to do his duty as herein directed, shall be fined for such neglect or refusal, in accordance with Section 5, Chap. 23, R. S., 4th Series.
