SECOND, CHAPTER OF ISAIAH. The word that Isaiab, the son of Amos, say concerning Judah and Jerusalem.

And it shall come to pass, in the last days, that the mountain (kingdom) of the Lord's House shall be established in the tops of the monutains, (established by law in the high places of the kingdoms) and shall be exalted above the hills, (smaller kingdoms) and all nations shall flow unto it; (i. e. people of all nations .) and many people shall go and SAY-Come ye, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the House of the God of Jacob, and he will teach us of his ways, and we will walk in his paths; for out of Zion shall go fortif the law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. And he shall judge among the mations and shall robuke many people, and they shall beat their awords into plough-shares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; and nation shall not lift up sword against nation, seither shall they learn war any more.

(Reader, do many people our this, now, in your hearing? If they do, it is the Last Days. Hear what Paulsays, in the 5th of 1st Thess, and 36 verse,) when they shall say, pepas and safety, then sudden destruction (not supports millenui-um) cometh upon them, as travailingon a shoman with child, and they shall not escape.

As Issish saw with the eye of prophetic visio the future state of the church and world, he ned his mouth with this invitation-O, House of Jacob, come ye and let us walk in the sight of the Lord. Then, directing his discourse to the Deity, he says, Therefore hast thou forsaken thy people, the House of Jacob, necause they be replenished from the east, and are SOOTHSAY-ERS, LIKE THE PHILISTINES, and they e thenselves in the children of strangers. Isalah ii. 7, 8, 9 : "Their land also is full ot silver and gold, neither is there any end of their treasures; their land is also full of horses, neither is there any end of their chariots. and also is full of idole; they worship the work of their own hands, that which their own fingers have made. And the mean man boweth down, and the great man humbleth himself; therefore forgive them not."

Then, addressing himself again to the people. says, Isaial, ii. 10, to the end of the chapter, "Enter into the rock, and hide thee in the dust, for fear of the Loan, and for the glory of his majesty. The lofty looks of man shall be humbled, and the haughtiness of men shall be bowed down and the Lone slone shall be exalted in that day, For the day of the Long of houts shall be moon every one that is proud and lofty, and upon every one that is lifted up , and ho shall be brought low: And upon all the cedare of Lebanon, that are high and lifted up, and upon all the cake of Bashan, and upon all the high mountains, and upon all the hills that are lifted up, and upon every high tower, and upon every fenced wall, and upon all the slups of Tarshish, and upon all pleasant pictures. And the loftiness of man shall be bowed down, and the haughliness of men shall be made low , and the Lonn alone shall be exalted in that Jay. And the idols he shall utterly abolish. And they shall go into the boles of the rocks, and into the caves of the earth, for fear of the Long, and for the glory of his majesty, when he arouth to shake terribly the earth. In that day a man shall cast his idole of silver, and his idels of gold, which they made each one for himself to worship, to the moles and to the bats, to go into the clefts of the rocks, and into the tops of the ranged rocks, for fear of the Long. and for the glory of his majesty, when he ariseth to shake terribly the earth. Cease ye from man, whose breath as in his nostrile. List wherein is hi to be accounted for.

That there can be no temporal millennium, proved by the words of our Saviour, in the 13th chapter of Matthew : The tares and the wheat grow together until the harvest. The tares are the children of the wicked one, the good seed, the children of the kingdom, the harrest, the end of the world."

DISTINCTION BETWEEN JEW AND GENTILE ABOLISHED BY CHRIST.

We have frequently been pained to hear pro lessed Christians, and even preachers, professing great degree of sympathy for the carnal Jew, and talking about the distinction between the unfulfilled promises, as though some of them referred to the carnal Jews, and others to the Gentiles; carrying the idea that God has made special promises to the infidel Jews, and that God (contrary to express Scripture declarations) is a respecter of persons. Romans 11. 10, 11: glory, honour, and peace, to every man that worketh good, to the Jew first, and also to the Gentile; for there is no respect of persons with

If God has kept up the distinction between Jow and Gentile, and still intends to give the lews the land of l'alestine for a thousand years, we must read these passages thus: But glory honour, and peace, to every man that worketh good, to the Jew first, and also to the Gentile, and, afterward, to all the Jews that remain; for our God has a very especial and particular respect for those Jews that may chance to live about the time of the temporal millennium; and though he will consign all their ancestors, who have lived and died in infidelity, to perdition, yet he will save them, and give them the promised land. We think Paul was about right in this matter. Romans x. 12: "For there is no difference between the Jew and the Greek : for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon Ephesians ii. 11-22: "Wherefore remember, that ye being in time past Gentiles in the flesh, who are called Uncircumciaion by that which is called the Circumcision in the flesh made by hands: That atthat time ye were without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope, and without God in the world: But now in Christ Jesus ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ. For he is nur peace, who hath made oth one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us; Having abolished in his flesh the enmity, even the law of commandments contained in ordinances, for to make in himself of twain one new man, se making peace; And that he might reconcile both unto God in see body by the cross, having slain the camity there by; And came and preached peace to you which were afar aff, and to them that were nigh. through him we both have scores by one Spirit unto the Fallest. Now, therefore, ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints, and of the household of God; And are built upon the foundation of the aponties and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone; In whom all the building

Heb. si. 8 . "By faith, Abraham, when he was called to go out into a place which he should after receive for an inheritance, obeyed, and he went it, not knowing whither he nent. Matt. vm. W. Isaiah prophesied from 760 to 706; Jeremial, 629 to 588 Ezekiel, 595 to 574; Daniel, 606 to 534; Hosea. 785; Joel, 785; Amos, 787; Obadiah, 587. Jonah, 862, Micah, 720; Nahuin, 720; Habbakkuk, 626, Zephaniah, 630; Haggai, 520; Zechariah, 520. The only return of the Jews yet future, is that in which the " ransomed of the Lord return, and come to Zion with songs and everlasting joy upon their heads." Ezek. xxxvn. 12-14. "Therefore, prophesy and say unto them, Thus sayeth the Lord Gop; Behold, () my people, I will open your graves, and cause you to come up out of god grave, and bring you into the land of Israel. And yo shall know that I am the Lord, when I have opened your graves.
