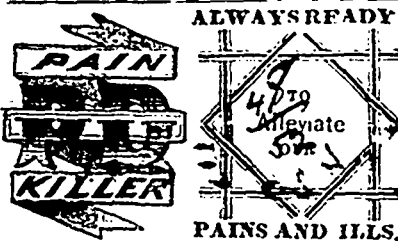

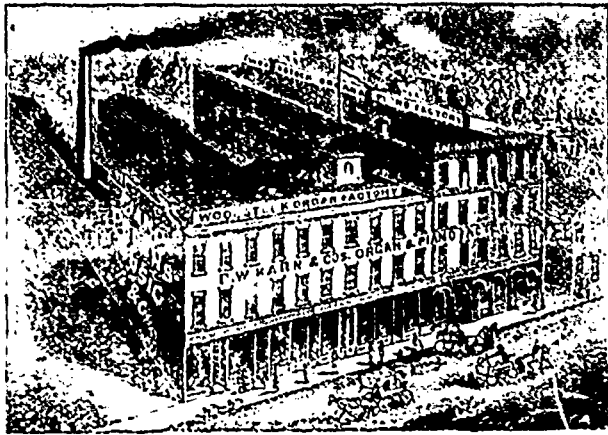

The Secretary of the Province of Ontario will receive tenders (to be addressed to him at his office at the Parliament Buildings, Toronto, and marked "Tenders for Coal") up to NOON of

TUESDAY, 19th MAY, 1885,

For the delivery of the following quantity of Coal in the sheds of the Institutions below named, on or before the 15th July, 1885:—

ASYLUM FOR THE INSANE, TORONTO—Hard Coal—900 tons large egg size, 175 tons stove size. Soft Coal—400 tons. CENTRAL PRISON, TORONTO—Hard Coal—20 tons chestnut size. Soft Coal—500 tons. REFORMATORY FOR FEMALES, TORONTO—Hard Coal—130 tons egg size. Soft Coal—500 tons.

ASYLUM FOR THE INSANE, LONDON—Hard Coal—200 tons large egg size, 60 tons chestnut size. Soft Coal—1,050 tons for steam and 150 tons for grates.

ASYLUM FOR THE INSANE, KINGSTON—Hard Coal—1,700 tons large egg size, 100 tons small egg size, 50 tons stove size, and 100 tons of Lehigh large egg size for gas-making. Soft Coal—100 tons.

ASYLUM FOR THE INSANE, HAMILTON—Hard Coal 200 tons egg size, 88 tons stove size, 46 tons large chestnut size. Soft Coal—1,075 tons. N.B.—275 tons of the soft coal and 5 tons of the large size chestnut coal to be delivered at the Plumbing House in the city.

Delivery is to be effected in a manner satisfactory to the authorities of the respective Institutions. Tenders will be received for the whole quantity specified or for the quantities required in each Institution.

An accepted cheque for \$500, payable to the order of the Secretary of the Province of Ontario, must accompany each tender as a guarantee of its bona fides, and two sufficient sureties will be required for the due fulfilment of each contract.
