

LATEST MARKETS.

Toronto, July 22, 1896. Wheat—The offerings of wheat are smaller, there is a better inquiry from the millers and the market is steadier. Cars of red and white sold north and west at 63c and 63c; new wheat is quoted outside at 63c to 61c. Old spring wheat sold, delivered at a mill outside at 60c. Manitoba wheat is steady, a 6,000 bush lot of No. 1 hard sold at 60c to-day. Midland No. 2 hard is quoted there at 60c. No. 1 hard is quoted about Fort William at 62c, at the Toronto and west, and 67c, Montreal freight. Flour—Is quiet. Cars of straight roller are quoted at \$8.20 Toronto freight. Mixed—Is steady at \$11 for shorts and \$10 for bran wheat. Oats—Are in fair demand; the offering are smaller and the market is steady at 17c for mixed and 12c for white wheat. Cars on the track here are quoted at 20c to 21c. Hams—Is quoted at \$2.60 for cars here and broken lots are quoted at \$2.75. Peas—The offerings are a little more liberal and the market is rather easier at 14c to 16c north and west and 45c to 16c middle freight. Butter—The demand holds slow and only the most choice lines show any rapid movement. Any stuff the least bit off condition has to be disposed of at a discount price. We have 100 lbs. of No. 123, medium tubs, 6c to 7c; choice large tubs, 10c to 12c; dairy pound prints, 13c to 14c, fresh made creamery tubs, 14c to 15c; creamery pound prints, 15c to 16c. Eggs—Unchanged and fairly steady at 45c for singles and 3c for large sets. Potatoes—This season's Canadian sell at 45c to 50c per bushel and Alisour's at 50c per bushel. Good southern sell at \$1.30 to \$1.50 per barrel. Baled Hay—Choice stuff is scarce and in demand at \$13 to \$15.00. Other lines are slow.

At the auction mart on the Millway wharf there was quite a lively sale and good prices were realized. There were sold a large quantity of fancy Illinois tomatoes, 150 boxes of California Bartlett pears, 50 boxes of fancy plums, 100 boxes of peaches, 35 barrels of pineapples, 100 boxes of fancy pineapples, 200 barrels of new potatoes, a quantity of buckberries, and a lot of other stuff. Huckleberries were plentiful at the Scott street market, and were lower in price, selling at 15c to 20c per basket. Raspberries were light to-day, as a result of the rain, as they hold firm. Butter bins are hard to sell, those going fetching as low as 25c to 30c per bushel. Illinois tomatoes were higher in price, fetching from 90c to \$1.10 per four-bushel case. Cucumbers are plentiful and low in price, bringing about 30c to 40c per basket. Black radishes are plentiful and sell at from 65c to 80c per basket. Harvest apples are weak, being turned over at from 15c to 30c per basket, with slow sale.

MONTREAL MARKETS. MONTREAL, July 20.—Grain—Oats are firm at 20c; peas, per 60 lb, about 44c to 55c; oats, No. 2 white, in store, 20c; barley, 44c to 45c; buckwheat, per 37 lb, 37c. Flour—There is some increase of business, owing to the low prices. Straight rollers, \$3.50 to \$3.70; strong bakers, Manitoba, best brands, \$3.50 to \$3.70; spring pat cakes, Manitoba, \$3.70 to \$3.90; winter patents, Ontario \$3.60 to \$3.80. Meal—Rolled, per lb, \$2.60 to \$2.80; standard, per lb, \$2.70 to \$2.80; per bag, \$1.30 to \$1.40; granulated, per bag, \$1.35 to \$1.40. Feed—Bran, \$11 to \$11.50; shorts, \$12 to \$12.50; middling, \$10 to \$11. Cattle—There were 6,000 boxes French cheese sold at the boat this morning at 63c. Butter—There was a fair jobbing business put through to-day at the old range of values. Creamery was quoted at 10c to 16c, and townships, at 14c to 15c. Eggs—The market is steady at 9c to 10c for best stock. Provisions—Canada short cut mutton, per lb, \$12 to \$12.50; Canada short cut, \$11 to \$11.50; hams, city cured, per lb, 5c to 10c; bacon, per lb, 5c to 10c; lard, pure Canadian, per lb, 7c to 8c; lard, common refined, per lb, 6c to 8c.
