WORK TO DO.

THE work of a Young Men's Christian Association is such as to give scope for every kind of talent. Therefore you need not think that there is no place for you in our ranks of *workers*.

Our Reception Committee will give you an opportunity to use for the Master your social qualifications. The duty of its members is to be present on stated evenings to receive strangers, converse with them, explain the working of our Association, and in other ways to make them realize that an invitation to our rooms implies a hearty welcome when they come among us.

The Invitation Committee will enable you to fulfil the Master's command, to "go and compel them to come in." Its members are engaged each Saturday evening in visiting the hotels and saloons, or standing at the street corners, where, by printed slip or word of mouth, they extend an invitation to attend the meeting for Young Men.

Our Visiting Committee will enable you to obey His command to visit the sick.

The Boarding House Committee (which might be called the most important Committee organized) will assign you a district in which to work among young men. The Committee now visits over 250 boarding houses each week, thus reaching over 2,500 young men; but "yet there is room" for workers—a vast number of young men are still beyond our reach.
