From the Daily Colonist. GREAT PUBLIC MEETING IN AID OF THE PATRIOTIC FUND. The public meeting called at the instance of the St. Andrew's Society, in pursuance of their resolution to devote the amount usually expended at their Anniversary Festival to the Patriotic Fund, established by Royal Proclamation, in aid of the Widows and Orphans of our brave soldiers dying while on service in the Eastern War, was held at the St. Lawrence Hall last night.

ing huts. In the morning of the 2nd the Russians attacked an advanced guard of the 50th Regiment, who retired. The Rifles advanced to its assistance, drove back the Russians, and forced them to quit their positions. The Turks are suffering from sickness. The Cholera has reappeared among them.

New batteries of thirty guns had been erected close to Sebastopol. Great precautions had been taken against the Russian fire directed against ninety-two rockets which had been landed to set fire to the Russian fleet. The Hannibal and Golden Plover have arrived with English troops. The garrison of Eupatori is being reinforced by two battalions. The Allies are easily and regularly supplied with provisions.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Dec. 4.—The Russians have driven back to their second line of defence. They have abandoned the Quarantine Battery, and ordered the guns to the ships. The Duke of Cambridge is still unwell. Prince Napoleon returns shortly to the Crimea. Two thousand British troops passed the Bosphorus for the Crimea on the 2nd December.

It is said that sixty thousand Russians had passed through Pera for the Crimea; and it is likewise reported that there had been an engagement between a corps of the Russians and a detachment of the English, and that the enemy had been pursued even to the walls of the town. SEBASTOPOL, Dec. 9.—General Montebello has arrived. It is asserted that Liprandi's corps has abandoned the heights of Balaklava to rejoin the Russian army which has taken position north of the Tchernaya.

Four English steamers (the Canada, Ripon, Thames, and Niagara), with 5,016 French troops on board, had arrived at Constantinople, en route to the Crimea. A despatch from Prince Menschikov, dated the 8th, says:—"Nothing new has taken place before Sebastopol. The enemy continued their fire but very feebly, and causing us scarcely any injury."

From the fleet, we learn that the three-deckers, after discharging their stores and some of their guns, were proceeding to the Bosphorus. The Admiral, in the Furious, was going with the Rodney and Vengeance to Karatsch Bay, where they were to be moored with a boom across the entrance. For the moment, the Agamemnon, Algiers, Terrible, Tribune, Fox, Beagle, Lynx, and Highflyer remained as a blockading squadron. The latter, however, was reported as about to cruise off Odessa.
