Question No. 1,347—**Mr. Orlikow:**

1. How many employees are there in the Public Service in the Scientific and Professional Category and, of these, how many in the national capital region are bilingual?
2. How many employees is it estimated there will be in the Scientific and Professional Category in the national capital region by 1975 and, of these, how many will be bilingual?
3. What was the annual rate of turnover in the Scientific and Professional Category by way of retirement, dismissal or resignation in the past five years?

**Hon. C. M. Drury (President of the Treasury Board):**

1. As of September 1970, there were 15,456 employees in the Scientific and Professional Category. The number of bilingual employees located in the national capital area is not presently available.<sup>1</sup>
2. The number of employees in the Scientific and Professional Category in the national capital region in 1975 will depend on policy and program decisions not yet made. In the four year period from 1966 to 1970 the number of employees in all categories in the national capital region increased by 14 per cent.

3. 1965-66, 12.0 per cent; 1966-67, 13.2 per cent; 1967-68, 10.5 per cent; 1968-69, 10.1 per cent; 1969-70, 13.5 per cent.

4. We are in no position to estimate the market for employees of this category and, therefore, are unable to make any predictions.

5. The target for bilingual employees in the Scientific and Professional Category in the national capital region by 1975 will be 15 per cent of the strength of the category located in that region.

**Hon. C. M. Drury (President of the Treasury Board):**

1. As of September 1970, there were 52,690 employees in the Administrative Support Category. The number of bilingual employees located in the national capital area is not presently available.<sup>1</sup>

2. The number of employees in the Administrative Support Category in the national capital region in 1975 will depend on policy and program decisions not yet made. In the four year period from 1966 to 1970, the number of employees in all categories in the national capital region increased by 14 per cent.

3. 1965-66, 15.6 per cent; 1966-67, 13.6 per cent; 1967-68, 13.4 per cent; 1968-69, 12.2 per cent; 1969-70, 9.3 per cent.

4. We are in no position to estimate the market for employees of this category and, therefore, are unable to make any predictions.

5. The target for bilingual employees in the Administrative Support Category in the national capital region by 1975 will be 35 per cent of the strength of the category located in that region.

In the four year period from 1966 to 1970, the number of employees in all categories in the national capital region increased by 14 per cent.

3. 1965-66, 5.1 per cent; 1966-67, 4.3 per cent; 1967-68, 6.5 per cent; 1968-69, 6.5 per cent; 1969-70, 5.0 per cent.
