Between the date of the presentation of the last budget May 25, 1976 and October 12, 1976, did the Office of the Prime Minister, Canadian Intergovernmental Conference Secretariat, Indian Claims Commission, Economic Council of Canada, Privy Council Office and Federal-Provincial Relations Office hire, dismiss or transfer employees to other departments and, if so, how many?

Mr. Ralph E. Goodale (Parliamentary Secretary to President of the Privy Council): Office of the Prime Minister: five employees transferred to other government departments or agencies. six employees left the public service for personal reasons. Nine employees were hired. One employee was laid off. Canadian Intergovernmental Conference Secretariat: one employee was hired. Indian Claims Commission: one employee was hired. Economic Council of Canada: 10 employees were hired. Five employees transferred to other government departments or agencies. Privy Council Office: 17 employees transferred to other government departments or agencies. 16 employees left the public service for personal reasons: four employees left during the probationary period. One employee was released. Two employees were laid off. 12 employees were hired. Federal-Provincial Relations Office: two employees transferred to other government departments or agencies. Three employees left the public service for personal reasons. Two employees were hired.

Question No. 707—Mr. McKinnon:

How many government employees are being sent, with their families, to reside in California to supervise various aspects of the Lockheed Aurora contract?

Mr. Ralph E. Goodale (Parliamentary Secretary to President of the Privy Council): In so far as the Department of National Defence is concerned: At present, a total of 84 personnel and their families are planned to be transferred to California in support of the CP-140 Aurora program. 25 of this group will be in California throughout the program. The other 59 personnel, who will be formed into various teams to accomplish specific tasks, will be there only for the length of time it takes to complete these tasks.

In so far as the Department of Supply and Services is concerned: Nine DSS employees and their dependants.
