

To cut it off, 'tis not defensible,
 As in *blamable, curable, sensible* ;
 But if *c* or soft *g* comes before ; in such case
 The *e* has a right to remain in its place :
 In peace it remains, in *peaceable, rangeable,*
 And, without any change, you find it in *changeable.*

 RULE 10.

But then, 'tis quite another thing,
 If to it comes an *ish* or *ing* ;
 Then *e* is lost, as seen in *dancing,*
Slavish, knavish, prudish, prancing.

 RULE 11.

Two words are oft made into one,
 Spell them as though each stood alone.
 You'll see at once that this is right,
 In *gasshouse, glasshouse, and skylight.*
 Exceptions—words in double *l,*
 They would be awkward thus to spell,
 And notice this you plainly will
 In *welfare, wilful, and fulfil.*
