

### TO DOUBLE-TRACK NIAGARA RAILWAY

Electric Radial Line Must Be Ready For Increased Trade.

### A NEW STEAMER ALSO

Sister Ship to Dalhousie City Will Soon Be Built.

### "UNCLE OF EUROPE" IS NOW HIS TITLE

The Kings of England, Denmark and Greece Are Nephews

### OF PRINCE WALDEMAR

He Twice Missed Having a Throne For Himself.

COPENHAGEN, Denmark, April 9.—The unique title of the "Uncle of Europe" passed through the death of King George of Greece to his brother, Prince Waldemar of Denmark, who as the only surviving son of the late King Christian IX. stands in that relation to the King of England, the King of Denmark, the King of Greece and the Czar of Russia. He twice narrowly missed a throne for himself during the lifetime of his brilliant and ambitious Bourbon wife, Princess Marie of Orleans. Waldemar had actually accepted the crown of Bulgaria when Czar Alexander of Russia brought such pressure to bear that the Danish prince had to put aside the proffered crown. Then the ambitious Marie began her diplomatic scheming to secure for him the throne of Norway, but in the end the youngest son of King Christian IX. was crowned.

As all these marriages have been blessed with children and the marriages of these children into other courts have been of frequent occurrence, it is readily to be seen that Prince Waldemar could hardly hang his hat up in any royal palace of Europe without having princes and princesses, to say nothing of kings and queens, announcing "Uncle Waldy is here!"

Prince Waldemar longed for the loss of two thrones was no bitter disappointment to Waldemar, but only to the active, scheming and witty Bourbon princess he married. They seem to have lived each quite genuinely, and to have lived most happily until the latter years of Prince Waldemar's life, when her eccentricities became so pronounced that the royal family had her for a time confined in a sanitarium, out of which, however, she escaped and went to France, where she made her residence in the Chateau d'Eau of the Count of Paris up to the time of her death.
