ARBITRATION OF OUTSTANDING PECUNIARY CLAIMS BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

THE "FAVOURITE"

MEMORIAL OF HIS BRITTANIC MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN SUPPORT OF THE CLAIM.

THIS is a claim for \$19,443.28 together with interest from November 30th, 1894, to the time of payment at Seven (7) per cent.

- 1. The "Favourite" was a British schooner registered at the Port of Victoria on the 18th day of June, 1868, her official number being 61302. She was owned by Laughlin McLeads, who was the Master thereof. Laughlin McLean is a British subject, born in the year 1854 at Little Sands in the Province of Prince Edward Island, and was the son of one Angus McLean. Angus McLean and his wife were born in Prince Edward Island.
- 2. R. P. Rithet & Co., Limited Liability, is and was a body incorporated under the laws of British Columbia 3rd January, 1891, and were managers of the said schooner.
- 3. By the award of the Tribunal of Arbitration constituted under the treaty of the 29th of February, 1892, between Her Britannic Majesty and the United States of America, certain regulations were prescribed governing the hunting of fur seals in that part of Behring Sea referred to in the said regulations.
