First Running of Latonia Championship With Fifteen Thousand Added Money.

Thousand Added Money.

Louisville, July 16.—The Kentucky raing commission at its meeting last week decreed 38 days of racing in the Blue Grass State this fall, with 22 of these days being run at Latonia. Lexington gets seven and Louisville nine. The commission evidently did not think well of the plan for 10 days' racing at Lexington and 25 at Latonia. They evidently believed that would be just a wrife too much.

At the time of granting the dates General Manager Winn had his stake list ready. High-class stakes are to be given at all the Kentucky tracks, but Latonia comes along with the big end of the stake program. In the first place, this meeting will witness the first running of the Latonia championship, with 115,000 added; also, the Queen City Championship Stake for two-year-olds, with \$10,000 added, and in addition to these there will be five other stake events run. In all a total of \$51,500 in added money will be given away during the 22 days, which means more than a daily average of \$2200 for stake events alone. This will bring the total added money to be given for 22 days of racing to a point beyond the \$275,000 mark, and it may be stretched to \$300,000, or nearly as much as was given for the spring meeting. It means in round numbers that during the year at Latonia horsemen will receive more than \$650,000 in purse meney.

What the Churchill Downs meeting is to Kentucky in the spring the Latonia possibly could do that would in any way take away the glamer of the Kentucky Derby. The Latonia race could be made a \$50,000 event, and still the Kentucky Derby would have the call, for it is run first. So the management of the two tracks, being in one hand, the ruling spirit has properly proclaimed that Latonia will be the big meeting in the fall.
