TOO MANY MINISTERS NOW

Rev. Dr. Woodworth Predicts Disaster if a Halt is Not Called and Attacks Superannuation Fund.

DR. GRIFFIN REFUTES THE CHARGE.

Says There is No Decline in the Fund—Four Probationers Received Into Full Connection.

The excitement ran high yesterday at the Toronto Methodist Conference, in consequence of the impending ministerial disaster predicted by the Missionary Society in the morning and the vehement denials made by Dr. Griffin in the afternoon.

The objectionable statements appeared in the report of Rev. Dr. Woodworth, superintendent of assignments, which were read in his absence by Rev. Dr. Sutherland.

Too Many Ministers.
The great obstacle confronting the committee, said the doctor, was the superfluity of ministers, crowded into congested centres, while the great west and the foreign fields were in need of the very men who were tumbling over each other at home without a station. This state of affairs contributed tremendously to cut up the superannuation fund, by the dozen, and even by the score, could ministers be counted who had been superannuated simply because there were no stations for them. It cost \$500 more to maintain these in 1900 than in 1898, while there was a decline in contributions to the superannuation fund.

"We have more men than we can support," cried the doctor. "We are coming up against a stone wall in ministerial superannuation. I predict an overwhelming disaster, unless we call a halt."

The Remedy Suggested.
Dr. Sutherland suggested as a remedy the combining of a lot of little circuits into fewer circuits of larger proportions, where a minister could be paid a respectable salary, that would enable him to work like a man.

Chancellor Burwash, in presenting the report of Victoria College, urged the formation of a Methodist historical society for the preservation of articles of interest in Canadian Methodism.

Principal Magaz of Wesley College, Montreal, spoke on behalf of that institution.

Dr. Griffin Refutes the Charge.
The seating capacity of the church was taxed to the utmost in the evening, when four young probationers, Arthur F. McKelvie, Virgil E. Hart, John A. Peck and William A. Sinclair, were received into full connection with the conference, next morning. Their ordination was moved by Rev. E. M. Burwash, president of the conference, and presided over by Chancellor Burwash, President Ockley.

Israel Tarte will go to the Yukon territory, leaving here, if possible, some time in August.

SERIOUS STRIKE AT OTTAWA.

Talk of Starting a Co-operative Factory—Plasterers Win Their Demands All Round.

Ottawa, June 7.—The woodworkers' strike here has assumed a serious aspect, as the men have not yet been out for a week. Some capitalists have come forward and offered to finance a factory to be run on the co-operative plan, and many of the men are in favor of accepting the offer and going into active competition with the big firms. A number of the best men, too, have left town and got work in Montreal.

The plasterers' strike was declared off this morning, the bosses agreeing to recognize the union and sign an agreement for one year to pay 30 cents an hour for the seven summer months, and 25 cents for the five winter months.
