MAY BE SENT TO ASYLUM

Man Who Shot Windsor Telegrapher
Believed to be Insane.

DETROIT, Aug. 12.—The police say to-day that a medical examination will be made of Delaney, the former Windsor telegrapher, who on Wednesday night shot two of his fellow operators in the Western Union office. Neither Delaney nor the police say that they will give him freedom, because of his mental condition. The police court will be asked to order an examination with a view to having him committed to an asylum.

Arthur McArdle, one of the men shot, after a release that placed him in a critical condition yesterday, is improving, and is expected to recover. Schwartz, who was wounded in the neck, is also doing well.

DYING OF STARVATION

Elderly Man Four Days and Nights in a Warehouse.

DETROIT, Mich., Aug. 12.—Benjamin De Witt, an elderly man, giving him home as Quebec, was discovered last night in a warehouse at Niles Mich., where he had been for four days and nights. When rescued he was in a dying condition from starvation.

Men with a moving van, who had stopped opposite the shed to throw their horses from the St. Joseph River, heard moaning sounds, and upon investigation discovered De Witt. He had been working on the Beebe Mint Farm, east of here, and wandered away. It is stated that he has children and relatives residing at Quebec.

ALBERTA'S WHEAT YIELD

Libel to Call it Banner Year, Says C. P. R. Lands Official.

CALGARY, Aug. 12.—C. W. Peterson of the Canadian Pacific Railway lands department, who has been on a tour of inspection of the company's land in Alberta, says:

"On the whole, I am disappointed. I had hoped that the crop conditions of Northern and Central Alberta would have been sufficient to warrant the bringing up the provincial average to respectable figures."

To characterize this year as a banner year for Central and Northern Alberta is to tell what is, perhaps, the richest mixed farming district in the province, next to the irrigated areas. "Where the winter wheat survived it is excellent. I should expect some very good yields of winter wheat from the north country this season. The spring wheat only appears to me to be fair, and where it is good the crop is very rank and will be late in ripening. Undoubtedly the poorest crop in the north this year is the oats. I scarcely saw a good crop of oats on my entire trip. The barley is fair to middling."

"Summing up the whole situation, the crop averages of Northern and Central Alberta this year will be very fair, but will not approach the high standard set during previous years."

Killed the Girl, Then Suicided.
NEW YORK, Aug. 12.—Because she spurned his affections, Frank Kindel, a young machinist, poked a revolver through the door of the bathroom, leading into the kitchen, where Frances Menger was clearing the dishes from the supper table, and fired three shots, all of which took effect in her heart.

While the girl was dying in the arms of her mother, and before anyone could interfere with him, Kindel fired a bullet into his own head.

Played With Dynamite Cartridge.
WESLAND, Aug. 12.—At Port Colborne yesterday morning Mate Cudney, nine years old, was terribly burned playing with a dynamite cartridge, which exploded. He may survive, but is likely to be blind.
