Turkey's proposal to occupy Thessaly no longer receives any consideration owing to Great Britain's attitude, while the proposal to Britain's attitude, while the proposal to abolish the capitulations in the case of Greek subjects in Turkey is rejected and the suggested extradition treaty is apparently set askle.

"The powers have fixed £6,000,000 as the highest limit indemnity and will allow only such a strategic alteration of the frontier as will not involve the subjection of any inhabited district to Turkish rule. Germany's demand for an international control of Greek finances has not been favorably received, as the Government hopes to raise a loan abroad on the guarantee of England, Russia and France, at low interest, to pay the indemnity, conceding certain revenues, but not accepting the principle of foreign control."

THE WOULD-BE REGICIDE.

Acciarite on Trial for His Attempt to Kill the King of Italy. Rome, May 28.—The trial of Pietro Acciarito, the ironworker of Artegna, province of Udine, who attempted to stab King Humbert on April 22, while His Majesty was on the way to the races, commenced to-day. The court room was crowded and there were many ladies among those present.

During the course of his examination Acciarito violently attacked the prevailing social conditions. He said he had acted alone and in despair, as men did when they committed suicide. The object of his attempt upon the life of the King, he explained, was to strike the representative of the class living in comfort. He added that his act was unpremediated, or otherwise he would have thrown a bomb.
