CANADIANS PLAY WITH THE SCOTTISH CURLERS

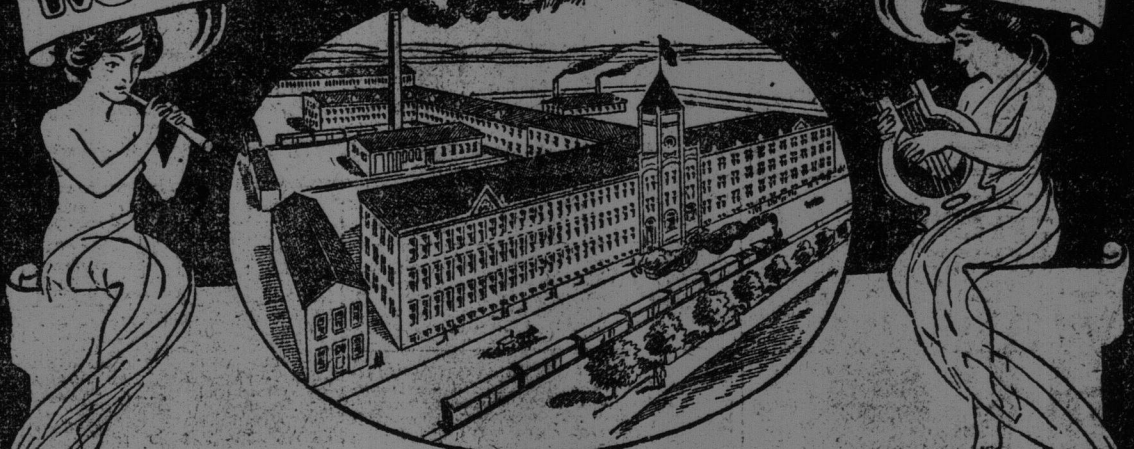

Mining Plants Suffer and Bridges and Houses Are Swept Away.

Johannesburg, Jan. 22.—One hundred and seventy-three persons are known to have lost their lives today as a result of the floods which are general throughout the Transvaal colony and northern Natal.
