

REPORT OF THE WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' SUB-COMMITTEE FOR 1875.

The income for the year 1875 was \$2387.24, derived from the following sources:—

Premiums from the Clergy	\$691.74
Interest on Investments	1417.60
Collections and Donations	277.90

Referring to the calculation upon which the fund was based, the above will shew that the premiums from the clergy are \$291 above the estimated amount, while the collections and donations are \$122 below that amount, which it was thought would be annually collected. The income for 1875 is \$144.54 above that for 1874.

The payments from the fund during the year have been \$2051.38, leaving \$335.86 to be funded.

There are now within the Dominion of Canada 49 Clergymen, holding certificates. Several Clergymen, formerly of this Diocese, have removed to other fields of work, and, in accordance with our rules, still hold their certificates and pay their premiums.

The 11th Rule has been so amended as to allow holders of certificates to travel within any part of Europe or of North America, North, of thirty-five degrees North Latitude.
