CANADIAN BANKING SYSTEM  
BETTER THAN UNITED STATES

Crisis Such As Faced American Banks Could Hardly Come in Canada--Banks Strengthening Themselves--Their Outside Safety Fund Reaches \$68,000,000.

(Special Montreal Correspondence of the Boston Transcript.)

The New York banking crisis has, of course, monopolized attention in financial circles here during the past two weeks. Everybody is surprised and disconcerted at the magnitude of the task so suddenly and unexpectedly thrown upon the shoulders of the metropolitan banks. The firmness they exhibited, and the unity of purpose, excites the highest praise. It is certain here, perhaps more clearly than in the States, that the difficulty of handling a situation such as developed on the suspension of the Knickerbocker Trust Company is multiplied many times by the peculiarity of your banking and currency system. In England the bankers would not be so much concerned, in confronting a similar crisis, by the fact that the Bank of England would supply the currency notes which depositors would be paid off. But a greater handicap than this is the system of individual banks in Canada, town and city, each having its own capital and its own reserves. In the time of a panic, from every village and town and city, hundreds of thousands of dollars would be required to meet the demands of depositors.
