## THE READVILLE HORSE SALE

**Some Good Prices Realized—  
J. M. Johnson Buys a Bingen  
Filly and Dam.**

Boston, May 25.—The horse sale at Readville appears to be gathering strength, for horses sold better yesterday than on either Monday or Tuesday. There was nothing remarkable before the auctioneer, but there were buyers on hand ready to take the offerings at prices which made most of the horses look like an even exchange of the horse for the money.

Royal R. Shelden, 2,044, and Cascade, 2,094, divided the top price honors, each bringing \$1,300. The former is now the property of C. D. King, of Patuxent (Md.), and the latter's owner is John McGuire, of New York dealer. Both these horses brought a bit more money than was generally expected.

The Electromot pacer, Lady Sealskin, 2:16 1/4. The Directum colt, Directum's Foster, cost J. F. Fitzgerald \$1,075. Bitcher & Palmer bid \$1,000 for the colt. The colt was bred by O. L. Woodard's Adion mare, Eliska, 2:04, at \$325, and it would not be surprising if she starts at the Ring when driven by the business with George Graves as her driver. C. H. Belledue's good mairline trotter, Susie K., will go to G. D. King, and will ride in the same car as Royal R. Sheldon. J. M. Johnson of Dallas (Tex.) added to his Ringland holdings by buying the Dexter Farms mare Florone, who has a filly by Ringan at her side.

## A THIRD TRIAL FOR SANDFORD

A Farmington (Maine) despatch of May 14th says:—  
"Rev. Frank W. Sanford, leader of the Holy Ghost and Healing as Shown

arrived here Wednesday for the purpose of renewing his bond of \$2,000 for an appeal before the present term of the supreme court for Franklin county, should he be decided to try him a third time on the charge of manslaughter.

"There is a probability that the trial of Rev. Frank W. Sandford charged with manslaughter in causing the death through neglect of Leander W. Bartlett, will not be tried at the term of court now in session here, as it has been expected

to do for a small community it has no superabundance of wealth and some of the leading citizens here are presenting the argument that it is too much to ask that the county shall bear the expense of a second trial for an alleged offense charged with having been committed in another county. The report is current that the objection being raised to the removal of the case in this county meets the approval of Justice Whitehouse, who is

holding at this term of court, although he has expressed no opinion in public concerning the matter. Among the attorneys, the belief is now held that the case will be postponed. It is further understood that Mr. Sandford objects to being tried in Franklin county, his country being that sentiment is as strong against him here as in his own county."
