BLAME SET FOR IRISH REVOLT

Partly Due to Birrell, Not to Womborne; Royal Commission Reports on Causes of Outbreak

London, July 3.—The report of the Royal Commission outlining the causes of the outbreak in Ireland, says: "In endeavoring to elucidate the causes of the rebellion in Ireland the fact should be borne in mind that there is always a section of opinion in that country bitterly opposed to British connection, and that in times of excitement this section can impose its sentiments on largely increased numbers of the people." The conclusion of the report points out that it is outside the scope of the commission's instructions to inquire how far the policy of the Irish executive was adopted by the cabinet as a whole, or to attach responsibility to any but the civil and military executive in Ireland.


