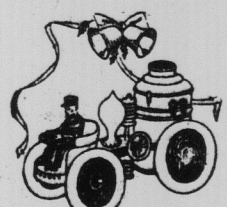

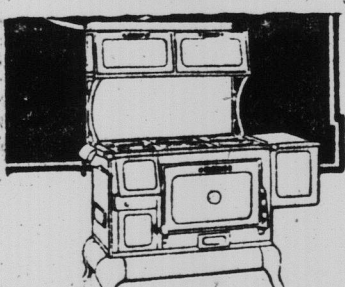

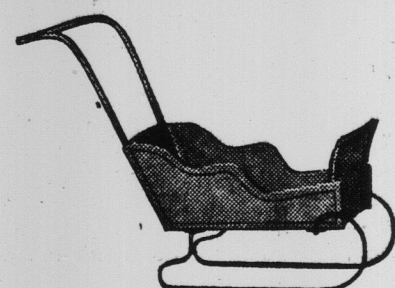
EXTRA SESSION

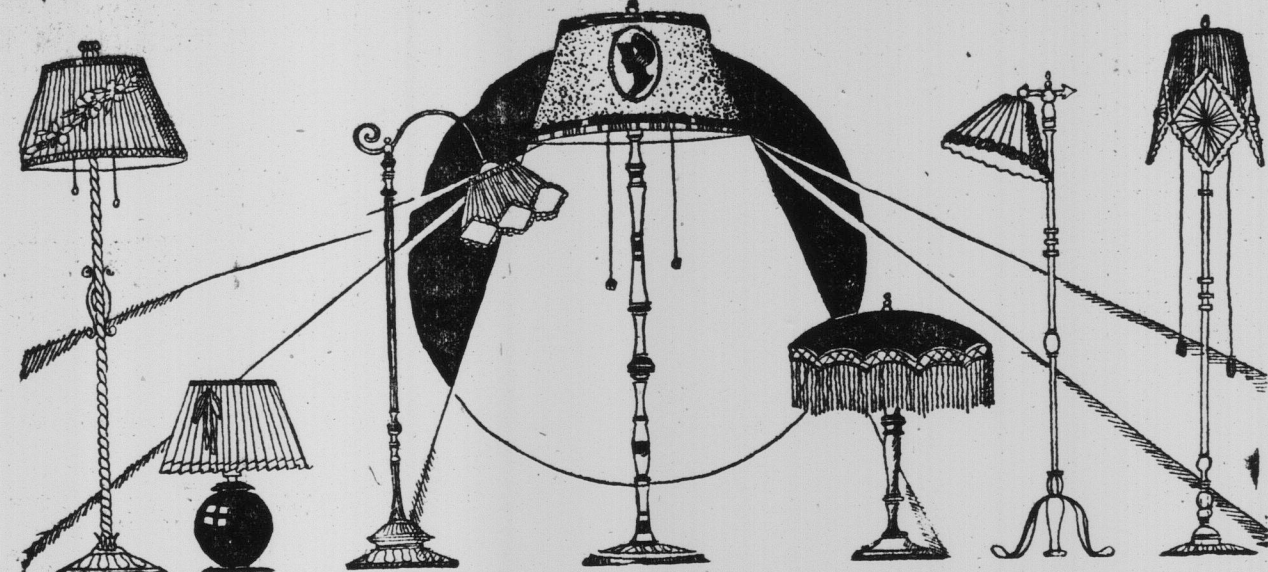
