

Natural History Society As Hospital For Sick Birds Is Figuring In a New Role

The Natural History Society is figuring in a new role just now. It is a hospital where sick birds make a marvellously rapid recovery. On Friday some kindly visitors brought to the museum a sadly forlorn specimen of a rusty red bird which turned out to be a fox sparrow. They found the little creature in pitiful condition lying on the sidewalk. Nobody knows what misfortune had befallen it but one eye was apparently blinded and the bird could hardly move. Its kind human friends did not know how to treat injured birds so they thought the best thing to do was to take it to Dr. William Macintosh at the Natural History museum.

The bird is well pleased with their selection of a hospital. It is now snugly at home in a canary cage getting as much exercise as its new quarters permit of and has fully recovered its appetite. Bird seed, plantain seed and rape seed form its diet at present and it is thriving well.

KEPT UNTIL SPRING.
Dr. Macintosh said yesterday that since the bird lost the use of one eye and could hardly have a fair chance at fending for itself and because the season was so far advanced that all its mates had gone south some time ago, there was only one thing to do, keep the bird in captivity until spring time.

The fox sparrow is so named because its coloring is a reddish brown like a fox's fur. Its breast is speckled with brown spots. The captive bird at the museum is a fine fellow of his kind and its tameness after so short a period of captivity is remarkable. Fox sparrows range all over North America but remain within the limits of civilization only for a short time in the spring and autumn. They are great scavengers among dead leaves and can make rubbish fly in a way which in proportion to its size a barnyard fowl could scarcely excel.

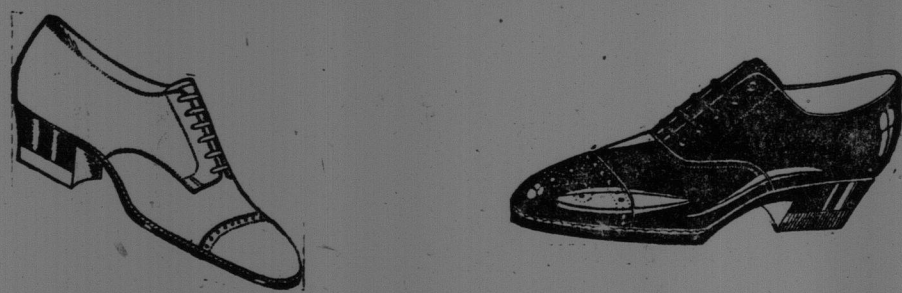

E. F. L. Wood Chosen Viceroy of India

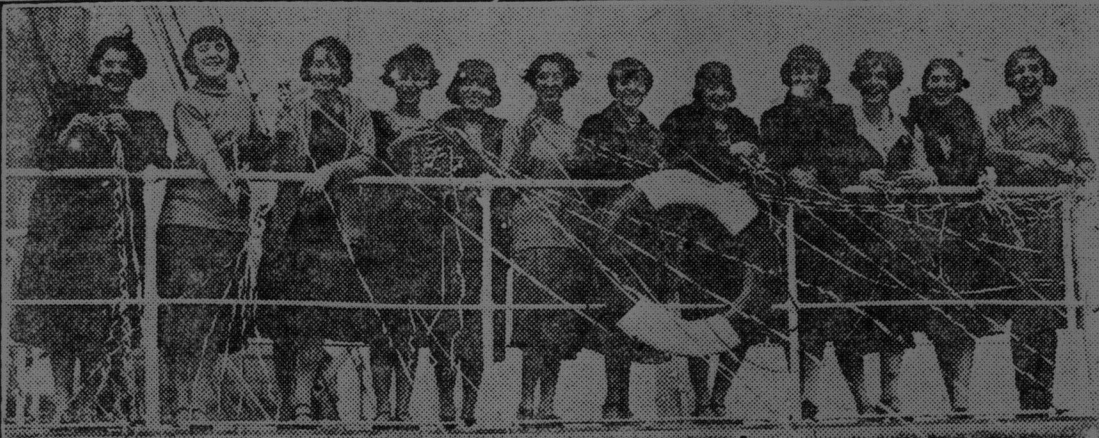

Mr. Wood is the heir to Viscount Halifax and is a Conservative member of Parliament for the Ripon Division of West Riding, Yorkshire. He was a member of Stanley Baldwin's first cabinet.
