High School Boys
Getting Ready For
Football Season

Have Started Training on the Old
Shamrock Grounds For Interscholastic
League Series

Endowed with a spirit of the "older boys" and a desire to emulate their achievements on the football field the senior members of St. John High School have started into making preparations for the coming football season. Daily they assemble on the old Shamrock grounds where they are beginning to learn the intricacies of the game. The chief object is to gain possession of the large silver trophy emblematic of the championship of the Interscholastic Football League, which was taken from them by Rotherham College boys last year. This incentive is spurring the boys on to a degree which is bound to bear fruit for already they are showing signs of developing into an aggregation which should make a name for itself during the coming season. Eight members of last year's team are back fighting for a place this year and in addition there are some fourteen or fifteen new candidates out trying for a place on the line-up. While the team will be considerably lighter than in former years, the members are apparently made of the "right stuff" and are making up in speed and pluck what they lack in weight. The forwards are showing up well in the preliminary workouts and should develop a good strong scrum, while the quarter backs promise to be in a class by themselves. The half line and fullback have yet to be selected from a promising group of candidates. When this has been done the boys will be put through some hard work by their coach.

AN IMPERIAL ATHLETIC MEET

British, Canadian and Australian
Soldiers Contest Events on English Field, With U. S. Officers and Men Assisting

Somewhere in England, Aug. 31—(Correspondent of The Associated Press)—British, Canadian and Australian soldiers contested in the athletic sports held by an army brigade here the other day. British contingent won the majority of the events, partly on the fact that more Britishers than any others participated.

A challenge shield, presented by the brigadier general, and a challenge cup, presented by an American colonel, were to be fought for. A cabinet minister was among the judges, and his wife was in charge of the distribution of prizes.

The soldiers, company after company, American, British, Canadian and Australian, marched in fours to the athletic ground, singing gay marching tunes. A line they formed little groups of truly international character around the open, cheering and shouting.

The final was won in 53-4-5 seconds—not bad time on wet grass. There was a long programme, all going through with the keenest enthusiasm, and an international flavor to almost every event. As the number of such successive winners was posted up, the stands cheered themselves hoarse. Meanwhile there was pipe music, glee, and performing various other evolutions and acrobatic stunts which a few years ago would have been deemed impossible.

The British contingent being numerically superior to the other nationalities engaged, won a majority of the events, but the results mattered little, for in these things the mere result is nothing in comparison with the spirit in which the events are contested and the cordial entente which results.

"It all looks bad for the boys," remarked the American Colonel to the British Brigadier as the men, Allies all, marched off the field.


