HINTS FOR ELECTORS CONNECTION WITH NEXT THURSDAY'S BALLOTING

The following extracts from the election law will be found valuable and timely. Before any elector is permitted to vote, the elector shall be furnished with a ballot by the returning officer, and the elector shall examine the ballot and be satisfied that it is correct. If the elector is not satisfied, he may demand another ballot, and the returning officer shall be bound to issue another ballot if the elector is not satisfied with the first one.
