I am now in receipt of your letter of May 8th inst., with accompanying documents. Mr. Tupper has a copy of the petition and he informed Mr. Mc. Leod, Mr. Hazen and myself that he entirely approved of what the petition contained, and was in entire accord with it. The minister has been in "communication with the Imperial government and the Board of Trade in England and in that he is doing everything that your board wish him to do.

I am fully of opinion that the interest of ship owners, and merchanis in this matter are being carefully and correctly and efficiently looked after.

The moment the government introduce their bill, I will send you a copy of it, although it will be passed through parliament very quickly, as it will no doubt be supported bybloth; sides of the house.
