IV. *Resolved*,—That, in the opinion of this Meeting, it is the duty of all Churchmen among us, while they rejoice in the efforts and progress of the church in other lands, to join with heartfelt zeal and unity and love in promoting her prosperity among ourselves. And therefore, to increase the energy of the operations of this Society it is desirable that deputations, like those which are now sent by the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel to every part of the United Kingdom, be sent into every part of this Province, to assist the resident clergy in explaining the nature and objects of this Society and encouraging the enrolment of every individual, both old and young, of every family in their flocks, among the members of an Association so peculiarly calculated as this Society is, with the Divine blessing, to nourish and extend a real love for Evangelical truth and Apostolic order.

The Hon. L. M. WILKINS then moved the fifth Resolution, which, being seconded by the Rev. Dr. TWINING, was adopted, as follows :—

V. *Resolved*,—That, in order to increase the interest of the members of the Society in all the efforts which they would make for the extension of the Church, new exertions be now made for adding to the present operations of the Society, by providing assistance to one or more Divinity Students at Windsor in the prosecution of their studies for the ministry ; in the hope that the progress of their studies in preparing for the work of the ministry, and their subsequent discharge of the duties of that sacred office, will animate the most affectionate feelings of all the members of the Society.

J. R. DEWOLF, Esq. M. P. P. then moved the sixth Resolution, which was seconded by EDW. ZWICKER, Esq. M. P. P., and passed :—

VI. *Resolved*,—That the thanks of the Society are due to the President, Vice Presidents, Officers and Committee
