



The first board is a board of conciliation, and its duty is to inquire into differences before things come to such a pass that a strike is imminent. If this board fails, then the usual procedure is to order a strike, and the contesting parties carry their case before the second board, which is the court of arbitration. The decisions of this court are final. As far back as the middle of 1901 dissatisfaction began to be felt with both these courts, especial to be felt with both these courts, especially with the board of conciliation. It was found to foment, rather than dissipate labor troubles, and the New Zealand house of representatives passed a resolu-tion that industrial disputes be carried to the arbitration court without any ref-erence to the conciliation board.
