



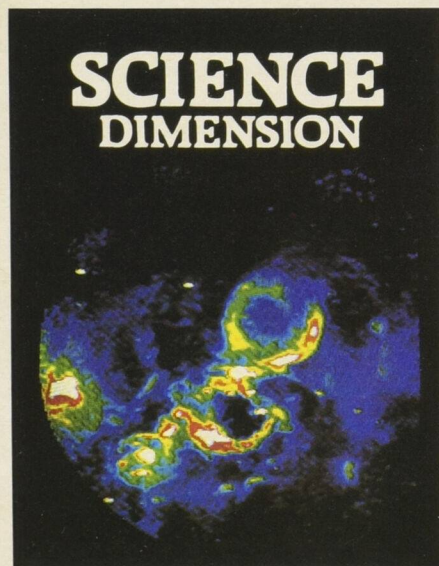

A 3-degree section of sky towards the constellation Sagitta holds a spectacular 'supernova remnant', the remains of an exploded star. This false-colour map encodes radio emission at 1420 MHz as black, blue, green, yellow, red, and white, in increasing order of intensity. (See Quest for the Invisible, p. 10.)
