Hon. Mackenzie King value to warrant an effort being made to continue it further. " Dr. F.J. Shepherd, 158 Mansfield Street. "I think the International Catalogue should be continued for the sake of the University." I am enclosing herewith a statement shewing the payments received from the Dominion Government towards the support of the International Catalogue. In addition to these amounts a certain sum, varying from \$500.00 to \$665.00, has been sent by the Government directly to London as the Canadian contribution towards printing the Catalogue. This money has never been under the control of the Canadian Bureau. Though the sum of \$665.00 for 1920-21 and of \$665.00 for 1921-22 have been included in the Estimates, the grant (\$2,000.00) for the support of the Bureau has not been included since 1919-20. In view of the fact that McGill has continued to do the work since that date at her own expense I hope you will consider the advisability of placing in the Estimates this year a sum sufficient to enable this work to be carried on.
