

BILL.

An Act to amend an Act intituled "An Act to incorporate the Niagara Harbour and Dock Company.

WHEREAS "the Niagara Harbour and Dock Company" and Clarke Gamble, Esquire, to whom the said Company have conveyed the premises vested in them by the Act of the Legislature of Upper Canada, passed in the first year of the Reign of His late Majesty, King William 4th intituled "*An Act to incorporate the Niagara Harbour and Dock Company*" in trust for certain purposes, have severally by petition prayed to be enabled to sell and dispose of the same:
10 — Be it therefore enacted, &c.,

That the said Company and Clarke Gamble, his heirs or assigns, shall be, and are hereby authorized and empowered by joint deed to grant, bargain, sell and transfer, to any person or body politic or corporate whatsoever, all the estate, right and title of the said Company and Clarke Gamble, his heirs, or assigns or of either of them, of, in, and to all and singular, the tracts of land and premises now held or occupied, by, or in any manner vested in or belonging to the said Company, or the said Clark Gamble, in trust as aforesaid, in the Town of Niagara and the County of Welland, and particularly the premises mentioned in the seventh section of the Act, first above cited and that the purchasers of the said premises or any part thereof shall not be bound to see to the performance of the said trusts.

The Company and Clarke Gamble, as Trustee, empowered to sell and convey certain property.

II. And for the removing of certain doubts that have arisen as to the powers of the said Company to construct and build vessels, steam engines and machinery, be it declared and enacted, That the said Company have had, and shall have, full power and authority to build, construct, possess, use, repair and refit, all and all manner of vessels, steamboats, shipping boats, steam engines, and other machinery of every kind, and to sell or otherwise dispose of the same as to the said Company shall seem expedient.
