Decorum 13. No Member shall speak disrespectfulin Debate. ly of Her Majesty, nor of any of the Royal Family, nor of the Governor or Person administering the Government of Canada; nor shall he use offensive words against either House, or against any Member thereof; nor shall he speak beside the Question in Debate. No Member may reflect upon any Vote of The House, except for the purpose of moving that such vote be rescinded.

14. Any Member may require the Ques-Reading the Question under discussion to be read at any time tion. of the Debate, but not so as to interrupt a Member while speaking.

15. No Member may speak twice to a No Mem-Question, except in explanation of a material part of his speech, in which he may have been misconceived, but then he is not to introduce new matter. A reply is allowed to a Member who has made a substantive motion to The House, but not to any Member who has moved an Order of the Day, an Amendment, the Previous Question, or an Instruction to a Committee.
