## 200 positions available across province

While Edmonton Hire-A-Student is creating businesses, other Alberta locations are looking for employees to fill some 200 positions across the province.

Currently ten communities are seeking Hire-A-Student centre managers. These include Barrhead, Fort Saskatchewan, Hinton, Lacombe, St. Albert, Sherwood Park, Spruce Grove, Stony Plain, and Vegreville. Recruitment has been going on for the past four weeks, but the student response has been almost nil.

Centre managers are hired by local committees with wages set competitively with those established as the "going rate" in the community.

The job qualifications are

basically a post-secondary student with a willingness to be creative and enthusiastic. These jobs provide invaluable learning experiences for students. Centre managers are expected to act as a public relations expert, a community development worker, a statistician, an administrator, and a financial recorder. Extensive training is provided to all successful candidates. As well, centre managers are never alone; resource persons are always on hand if assistance is required.

## Comfort Contact Lens

### Questions and Answers Second of Four Parts

The first thing is to determine that the person is properly licensed for the fitting of contact lenses. This is a must, ask when you phone.

When talking to the prospective company see if they are helpful and willing to answer your questions without trying to persuade you to "come in" for an explanation. If there is reluctance to discuss their service, lenses, or price there may be a reason. See if the first appointment is at no obligation as this will allow you to ask further questions and help to determine the compatibility between yourself and your fitter. The latter can be quite important as your relationship will last for quite a few years.

Also, is the fitter there fulltime? This can present difficulties if you are having a problem on Thursday and the office is only open Tuesday and Wednesday. What do you do? The answer is, you and your problem wait. Make sure his practice and your interests are a fulltime occupation.

Another factor is to try and determine the reliability of the company you intend to deal with. Getting a good price or "deal" won't help if the company or doctor isn't there next year. Generally if the company has been around for 7 or 8 years with the same personnel that's a reasonable indication that you will receive good and continuing service.
