

Cambre, was payment in full, for all his improvements, and for damages sustained by him; but that the Company will still have to pay for the land, which money, when paid, will be held by this Department, for the benefit of the whole bands.

In this connection, I have to request that you will instruct a duly qualified Department Land-Surveyor who may live at, or be at present within a convenient distance of the Mistayashil Reserve, to make a valuation of the land and damages of the right of way of the C. P. Railway Co through the Mistayashil No 2 Indian reserve; and to have, in making his valuation, regard to the provisions of the Railway Act bearing on the same, especially sections 153 and 154 of said act.
